The Act creating the commission carried no appropriation whatever, so that the commissioners in addition to donating their own time to the State have been obliged to become responsible for the payment of a reasonable amount for the services of a secretary, stenographer's fees, printing and other necessary items, which should be promptly and cheerfully paid by your Honorable Body.

The distinguished gentlemen composing the commission have practically completed their labors and will no doubt make a report for the consideration of your Honorable Body in good season.
