worth, the devotion to duty, the eminent and conservative ability of Mr. Hurst and to recommend to his fellow men yet loving his strict integrity, his loyalty to his State and his high regard of true citizenship of Maryland.

Therefore, Be it resolved, that the Senate of Maryland by passage of this resolution testify its appreciation of his noble qualities of heart and mind.

Be it resolved further. That an engressed copy of this resolution be forwarded by the secretary of the Senate to the bereaved family of Mr. Hurst.

Be it further resolved, That a copy of this resolution

be entered on the Journal of the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Gill, said resolutions were adopted by a rising vote.
