Ordered, That Miss Katharine McDonnell and Mrs. Manpin be, and they are hereby, appointed stenographers and typewriters for the Senate.

Which was adopted.

On motion of M1. Gorman, it was

Ordered, That the hour of 12 o'clock, noon, be and the same shall, until otherwise ordered, be the hour of meeting of the Senate.

Which was adopted.

On motion of Mr. Brewington, it was

Ordered, That the postmaster of the Senate, be and he is hereby directed to furnish to each Senator, the Secretary, Journal Clerk and Reading Clerk, twenty-five dollars worth of postage stamps, and the other elected officers of the Senate five dollars worth of postage stamps.
