

JOINT CONVENTION.

The members of the Senate accompanied by the committee appointed by the House, proceeded to the chamber of the House of Delegates, and took the seats assigned to them.

The returns for the election of Governor were then opened by the Speaker of the House of Delegates in the presence of the members of both houses, in conformity with the provisions of the Constitution, Article 2, section 3, and were read by the Speaker.

It was found that the Hon. Edwin Warfield had received 108,548 votes.

That Hon. Stevenson A. Williams had received 95,923 votes.

That Hon. William Gisriel had received 2,913 votes.

That Hon. Silas M. Grabill had received 1,302 votes.

Whereupon

The Speaker declared that the Hon. Edwin Warfield having received the highest number of votes cast was duly elected Governor of Maryland for the term of four years from the time of his qualification, as prescribed by the Constitution.

The Speaker then declared the Joint Convention adjourned, and the members of the Senate returned to the Senate Chamber.
