And be it enacted, That all the powers and authorities at present exercised by the executive of this state, shall be and hereby are vested in the governor, except the appointment of chancellor, judges of the courts of common law, attorney general, general, field and general staff officers, who shall be nominated by the governor and approved of by the senate.

Oaths.

14. And be it enacted, That the governor appointed by virtue of this act, or the person authorised to act in his place shall take the same oaths of office as are now directed to be taken by

15. And be it enacted, That all and every part of the constitupugnant laws. tution and form of government of this state, which relates to the election of the governor and to the election of the council to the governor that is in any manner repugnant to or inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be, and the same is hereby repealed upon the confirmation hereof.

Confirmatory provision.

16. And be it enacted, That if this act shall be confirmed by the General Assembly of Maryland, after the next election of delegates, in the first session after such new election, as the constitution and form of government direct, that in such case this act and the alterations and amendments of the constitution and form of government herein contained, shall be taken and considered and shall constitute and be valid as a part of the said constitution and form of government to all intents and purposes, any thing in said constitution and form of government to the
