Sec 1835: it shall and may be lawful for the said Thomas Cradock Walker, and John Cradock Walker, at all times hereafter, to be called and known by, and hold and use the name of Thomas Cradock and John Cradock, and by that name to sue, and be sued, in any court of equity or law.

Act confirmed. 2. *And be it enacted,* That all securities, promises, contracts, assurances, deeds, and lawful acts whatsoever hereafter to be made and done, by the name of Thomas Cradock and John Cradock, shall be of the same force and effect, and equally avail to all intents and purposes, as if the name of Thomas Cradock and John Cradock had been the original and proper name of the said Thomas Cradock Walker, and John Cradock Walker.

CHAPTER 27.

Passed Jan. 26, 1826.

An Act to confirm an Act, passed at December Session, eighteen hundred and twenty-four, entitled "An Act to alter and repeal such parts of the constitution and form of government, as relate to the division of Somerset county, into election districts" and for other purposes.

Alteration confirmed.

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That an act passed at December session eighteen hundred and twenty-four, entitled "An Act to alter and repeal such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the division of Somerset county into election districts," shall be and the same is hereby confirmed.

Commissioners—compensation.

2. *And be it enacted,* That the commissioners to be appointed by the levy court, as provided by the said act, which commissioners are not to exceed five in number, shall be and they are hereby authorised and required to contract for, and determine the proper *quantum* of compensation to be allowed to the proprietors of the place for holding the election in each of the said districts, if any be demanded, which compensation shall be levied, collected and paid, as other charges upon the county are levied, collected and paid.

CHAPTER 28.

Passed Jan. 26, 1826.

An act to incorporate a School by the name of the Cincinnati School in Harford County.

Incorporation

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Alexander Hanna, Henry Woolsey, Preston M'Comas, James Moores and Lithourn B. Rogers, as trustees of a school called and hereafter to be known by the name of the Cincinnati School in Harford county, shall be, and they and their successors in the trust aforesaid, are hereby declared to be a body corporate for ever hereafter, by the name and style of the trustees of the Cincinnati School of Harford county and by that
