## No. 46.

*Resolved*, That William Browne and Elisha N. Browne of the city of Baltimore, executors of John Browne, late clerk of Queen Ann's county court, be and they are hereby authorized and required to proceed to bring up under the direction of one of the judges of Queen Ann's county court, certain records, as provided for by the fifth section of an act concerning the judgments and judicial proceedings of the courts of justice in this state, and to provide for the completion of records in such cases, passed December session eighteen hundred and seventeen, chapter one hundred and nineteen, and that the actions now pending on the clerks bond shall be continued from time to time, at the discretion of Queen Ann's county court, or of the court in which the said actions were instituted against the said Elisha Browne and Wm. N. Browne, executors as aforesaid, and that when the said records shall have been completed, agreeably to the said fifth section of the above recited act, then the said actions to be discontinued upon defendants paying costs.
