3. And be it enacted, That the said regiment of cavalry here. Dec lea 130 by authorised to be raised, to be attached to the brigede as aforesaid, shall be called the First Light Cavalry Regiment of Baltimore Volunteers, with the usual field and other officers; and the recommendation and appointment of officers for the same. be made, and the regulations followed agreeably to the rule as laid down in the seventh section of the act to which this is a supplement.

6. And be it enacted. That whenever the foregoing companies Officers to be of light infantry, and the regiment of riflemen shall have com- commissioned plied with the requisitions of this act, and recommend the general, field and other officers for the organization of said bris gade, the governor and council shall issue commissions requi-

Bite to carry the same into effect.

7. And be it enacted, That all the officers to be appointed in said brigade shall in every instance be recommended to the consideration of the governor and council; previous y to such appointment in the manner following, to wit: The brigadier general shall be recommended by the colonels, lieutenant colonels, and majors of the regiments of said brigade or a majority of them present at the meeting called for the purpose; the colonels shall be recommended by the lieutenant colonel, majors and commanding officers of companies of their respective regiments or a majority of them present at the meeting called for the purpose; the lieutenant colonels shall be recommended by the majors and commanding officers of companies of their rese pective regiments or a majority of them present at the meeting called for the purpose; the majors shall be recommended by the commanding officers of companies of their respective regiments or a majority of them present at the meeting called for the purpurpose; the company officers respectively shall be recommende ed by the members of their company or a majority of them present at the meeting called for the purpose; and the brigade and regimental staff officers shall be recommended by the rese pective commanding officers of the brigade and regiments; and whenever a brigadier general is to be recommended the oldest commanding officer in rank in said brigade, shall give three days notice of the time and place of holding the meeting therefor, in at least three of the public news-papers in the city of Baltimore, and whenever a colonel is to be recommended a similar notice shall be given by the oldest officer in rank in his regiment, and whenever a lieutenant colonel, major or company officer is to be recommended a similar notice shall be given by the commanding officer of his regiment. And any of such meetings may adjourn from time to time, until the said recommendation shall have been decided on, provided notice thereof is made public as an foresaid; and the said meetings respectively shall appoint a secretary who shall certify to the proceedings thereof and within three days thereafter transmit them to the officer to whom by the
