CHAPTER 104.

An act for the relief of David Martin, of the city of Baltimore.

Passed Feb 13, 1826.

Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Insolvent: That David Martin, of the city of Baltimore, be, and he is hereby authorised to prefer his petition for the benefit of the insolvent laws of this state, to the commissioners of insolvent debtors for the city of Baltimore, notwithstanding that two years have not elapsed since his former application.

2. And best enacted, That the commissioners of insolvent Court direcdebtors, and the judges of Baltimore county court are hereby ted. authorised and required to receive and hear the petition of David Martin, and to grant to the said David Martin the benefit of the several acts of assembly passed for the relief of insolvent debtors, if he shall be entitled thereto, notwithstanding the failure of his former application.

CHAPTER 105.

An act authorising the levy court of Washington county, to levy a sum of money for the purpose of repairing and rebuilding a bridge over Conococheague creek, near the Broad Fording.

Passed Feb. 24, 1826.

Levy autho-

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the levy court of Washington county, be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to levy on the assessable property of said county, in two or more equal annual levies, to commence in the year eighteen hundred and twenty six, such sums of money as they in their judg nent may deem necessary to repair or rebuild the bridge over the Conococheague creek near the Broad Fording, and to adopt such measures as to them may seem most expedient for repairing or rebuilding said bridge.

CHAPTER 106.

An act to divorce John T. Shanks, and Lydia Shanks, his wife, of Dorchester county.

Fassed Feb 22, 1826.

Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Divorce. the said John T. Shanks, be, and he is hereby divorced from
