To run cars at regular size

Sec. 19. And be it enacted, That said company shall start and run their cars for the transportation of passengers and property at regular times, to be fixed by public notice, and shall furnish sufficient accommodations for the transportation of all such passengers and property, as shall within a reasonable time previous thereto, be offered for transportation at the place of starting and at the usual stopping places established for receiving and discharging way passengers and freight for that train, and shall take, transport and discharge such passengers and property, at, from and to such places on the due payment of the freight or fare, legally authorised therefor, and shall be liable to the party aggrieved in an action for damages for any neglect or refusal in the premises.

When to be commenced and finished.

SEC. 20. And be it enacted, That if the road authorised by this act to be made, shall not be commenced within two years from the passage of this act, and shall not be completed within five years after it shall have been commenced, then this act shall be void and the powers conferred by it shall cease.

SEC. 21. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Passed May AN ACT to make valid a deed from George Hansel, 19, 1853.

and wife of Pennsylvania to Henry Koontz, of Allegany County.

Preamble.

Whereas, Henry Koontz of Allegany county, has shown to this General Assembly, that George Hansel and Fanny Hansel, his wife, of Fayette county, in the State of Pennsylvania did make and deliver to said Henry Koontz a certain deed bearing date December tenth, eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, for certain property described in said deed, which was duly recorded among the land records of Allegany county aforesaid in Liber A. B., number W. folios four hundred and seventeen and four hundred and eighteen; And whereas, it appears that said deed was acknowledge by the grantors before a justice of the peace of said Fayette county, instead of a judge of a court of law and of record, and the acknowledgment so made before said justice by said Fanny Hansel is not in the
