Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That this act shall take In force. effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 206.

AN ACT to amend the second section of an act passed Passed May on the thirty-first day of March, eighteen hundred and 12, 1853. fifty-three, entitled, an act for the more effectual suppression of Crimes.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly Amended. of Maryland, That the provisions of the second section of the act passed on the thirty-first of March, eighteen hundred and fifty-three, entitled, an act for the more effectual suppression of crimes, shall extend only to such assaults and batteries as are committed without any provocation.

Sec. 2.
