AN ACT requiring prisoners convicted of offences in Passed March the city of Baltimore, to be put to labor and withholding from them certain privileges.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly Required to of Maryland, That persons convicted of offences in labor. the criminal court of Baltimore, after the thirteenth day of April next, and who are sentenced to imprisonment in Baltimore city and county jail, shall be put to and required to labor during such confinement.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That persons hereafter To be kept on sentenced to be imprisoned for offences in the said jail prison fare. by the said court shall be kept on prison fare, and not be allowed any other food or drink, unless by the written direction of the physician of the jail.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That no admission of Visitors not visitors shall be allowed to condemned prisoners during allowed. their confinement, except the official visitors of the jail, ministers of the gespel, physicians and legal counsel.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That nothing in this Not to apply act contained shall apply to prisoners in the said jail to prisoners who are under sentence of death.

CHAPTER 44.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That a stay of execution be entered on cution to be each of the judgments in the circuit court for Kent county entered. against William H. Blackiston, and his sureties in favor of the State, for monies due the State from said Blackiston, as collector of said county until the fifteenth day September in the year eighteen hundred and fifty-five, on this condition, that the defendants in said judgments pay one-half of the sum due thereon on or before the fifteenth day of September eighteen hundred and fifty-four.
