Know all men by these presents that wee Ellen Coglammie administratrix of womey Coglammie  
 deceased and William Bowen and John Hauick all of the County of Sommerset & Province of  
 Maryland doe acknowledge our selves to owe and are indebted vnto their Ma<sup>ties</sup> William &  
 Mary King & Lucene of England &c the Just Summe of fifty eight pounds fourteen shillings  
 Sterling money of England w<sup>ch</sup> wee promise to pay to their Ma<sup>ties</sup> or successors And for the true  
 performanc of the same to be well and truly paid wee binde vs & each of vs our heires & exors  
 & administrators for and in the whole In Testimony whereof wee have herevnto sett<sup>o</sup> hands  
 & seals this 27<sup>th</sup> day of June in the second year of their Ma<sup>ties</sup> Reigne and in the year of our  
 Lord God one thousand six hundred & ninety /

The Condition of this Obligation is such that if the above bound Ellen Coglammie doe well & truly observe  
 & satisfie all & every of the will of womey Coglammie bearing date y<sup>e</sup> 14<sup>th</sup> day of March Anno <sup>1689</sup> So<sup>l</sup> one thousand  
 six hundred eighty nine as well as to pay <sup>all</sup> every the debts of the said deceased upon ord<sup>r</sup> had & obtained from her  
 Ma<sup>ties</sup> Justice of the Peace in Court sitting as aforesaid observe the Statutes & Clauses in the s<sup>d</sup> Statute of Administration  
 and to make no such sale or destruction in or upon the real estate of orphans (viz) dwelling houses and  
 houses lands woods or tithes and the same observing that said Statute an Act for preservation of orphans  
 real estate that then this obligation to be void & of none effect otherwise to hold & remaine in full force power  
 & vertue
