granted the 10. day of November Anno Domini 1697. And also to make new waste sale or distribution of in or upon the real Estate of Orphan  
viz dwelling house out house, lands woods Or hard houses. Bearing the law and statute in that for preservation of Orphan's real Estate as also  
to keep and sell the Justices of Peace of Somerset County for Relief of Wills & granting of debts & also for of Justice from Court and

**In the Name of God Amen.** The tenth day of April in the year of our Lord God One thousand  
Six hundred ninety and One. I Edmund Beauchamp Mayor of London and at the writing house of County Clerk of Somerset  
in the County of Maryland being sick in body but of good & perfect memory thank be unto all mighty God, calling  
to remembrance the uncertain Estate of this transitory life, and that all flesh must yield unto death when it shall  
please God to call. Do make, constitute Ordain & declare this my last will and Testament in manner and form following  
and declared either by word or writing, and this to be taken Only for my last Will and Testament and none other  
And first being penitent and sorry from the bottom of my heart for my sins past most humbly desire forgiveness of the  
same. Give and commit my soul unto all mighty God my saviour and Redeemer in whom and by the merits of Jesus  
Christ. I trust and believe assuredly to be saved and to have and to have full remission and forgiveness of all my sins  
that my soul with my body at the day of resurrection shall rise again with joy, and through the merits of Christ's death  
and passion possess and inherit the Kingdom of Heaven prepared for his Elect and Chosen And my body to be buried  
decently at the discretion of my Executor. And now for the settling my temporal Estate and sure goods and debts as it  
hath pleased God far above my desert to bestow upon me. I do give and dispose the same in manner and form following  
(That is to say) first I will that all debts due and owing as how in Right or Custody to any manner of person or  
person, what so ever shall be well and truly counted and paid or Ordained to be paid within convenient time after  
my death by my Executor hereafter named. I give and bequeath unto my wife Sarah Beauchamp  
my best feather bed and appurtenances thereto belonging viz) Rugs Blankets Sheets bolster Pillow Curtains &  
Covers three Chairs, two Green pots, One Frying pan the Land where she now lieth, bounded from the first boundary  
of my son Thomas Land to the corner of my son John Beauchamp's Land to have and to hold the same during her  
widowhood, Also I give and bequeath to her twelve pound in money Sterling to be paid her by my Executor hereafter  
named in convenient time. I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Beauchamp my horse Duff my  
Gun and wearing apparel and all my good due arrears at Entering the Clerk's place before Wm. B. and  
my self were entered as partners together, as also I give and bequeath unto my said son Thomas Beauchamp  
One Cow and One ewe with their increase both male and female. I give and bequeath unto my son  
Edmund Beauchamp that part of my dovecot of Land called Coulston beginning at a corner tree of my son Thomas  
by surveyants made over to him by my self and wife by the first road by the lower dam & so up the highest side  
of the dam untill it come to the uppermost dam then ninety paces to a marked tree, and from thence to the  
corner tree of my son Thomas Land on the westernmost side of the first road, and then along the first road to the corner  
tree of my son Thomas Beauchamp Land the first boundary also I give and bequeath unto him my son Edmund  
One Cow with calves or Cattle by her side, also the 1/2 part my Ware House beginning where male or female
