ORDERED by this Court that the Clerk that now is have some Controversy at in the said Whittington  
with a certain party to return his records in during the time of Court

Stephen Sage by Roguizans etc. acknowledges & Confesses him self to be indebted to the said Whittington  
the sum of twenty bound Sterling money of England due to be levied upon his goods & Chatters lands  
& possessions for their Malice used or likewise Committed the said Sage & his wife viz in Matthew Harbrow  
and most London & by Roguizans etc. likewise Confesses him self to be indebted in the sum of ten  
pounds apiece to be levied for their Malice used as supra.

The Condition of which Roguizans is that if the above bound Stephen Sage, his  
wife Griegst his son Thomas & his daughter Infama do make their personall appearances at our  
next County Court to be holden the second Tuesday in January, then & there to answer to such things  
as shall be objected against them on their Malice Chatters or then the Roguizans to be void  
& of new effect, otherwise to be & remain in full power force & virtue.

M. Andrew Whittington at the Leavy being Brought account into Court of Comrs Expenses amounting  
to 7292:7/8 The Court allowed the said Whittington to be paid of the Leavy then 6000. so that the  
Comrs then was debtor to the said Whittington 1292:7/8 which being subtracted from their year for Leavy viz 3600  
then was left due to the said Comrs 2307:1/8 from the said Whittington. Besides 543. which the said Whittington was  
indebted to the Comrs in Decr. 1689. which the Court finds no Credit for.

The said Whittington Confesses judgment to the above 2307:1/8. pounds of the Law. & desired of his worship a  
Continuance of Ordinary keeping which by the Court was granted

M. John Webb did likewise Confess judgment to the Court for 3600 pounds of the Law for 3 years Leavy  
for Ordinary keeping last past & desired a Continuance which by the Court was granted

The Court adjourned till the second Tuesday in Jan: 1691
