The Deposition of W^m Oswoth aged about sixty years this y^e Deposition saith that about October 1690 he was requested by Thomas Oxford upon great Damages done to y^e sd Oxford stock of swine by y^e sd Bage & his People to come in Company with John Barr y^e sd Bages friend y^e which was y^e sd party with y^e Leave of y^e sd Bage & his wife for the sake of our knowledge, & we found y^e sd party very desirous to y^e swine might with ease pass through y^e sd fence in divers places which y^e sd Bage was a spectator of as well as we y^e witnesses aforesd. And y^e sd Deposition doo further say y^e he heard y^e sd Thomas Oxford challenge or tax y^e sd Bage for his unreasonable and unneighbourly usage of his swine and y^e sd Bage replied he was sorry he had not done worse by them that he had not kill or kill on of their hamskins and put y^e other legs thorough rendering y^e following reason, to wit, because Thomas Oxford asked y^e sd Bage too Dear y^e year before for Corn, moreover y^e sd Deposition was an eye witness to y^e hunting & abusing of y^e sd swine which was an extraordinary bad Injustice that Divers of y^e y^e were not in a Condition to move or goe forth for their Livings but lay Day after Day in Condition more like to Dye then to live this y^e sd Deposition saith & further now he saith not witness his hand
