I give & bequeath the plantation & land whereon I now live with all houses edifices & conveniences
there unto belonging above mentioned after my wife Janes decease marriage or refusal as above
mentioned w^{ch} shall first happen unto my loving son George Jones & the heirs of his body lawfully
begotten for ever

6^{thly}

I give and bequeath unto my loving son ~~Robert~~ Robert Jones and the heirs of his body lawfully
begotten for ever the remainder of my tract of land beginning on the west side of Poplar Branch from
running to the Land of George Mitchell and so half way through the Swamp intersecting his Brother Johns
Lands as aforesaid but in case my son Robert should die without issue of his body lawfully begotten then it
is my will & desire that my son George Jones doe enjoy the said parcel of Land in this my will mentioned
to him & the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever and if Robert & George should both die without issue
of their bodies lawfully begotten then my son John Jones doe enjoy the above said Land bequeathed to them
& the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever and if John Jones should die without issue of his body
lawfully begotten then it is my will my son Robert Jones doe enjoy the above mentioned plantation Land & premises to him
& the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever And I doe appoint my sons to be at age when they shall accomplish
the age of eighteen years and that they remaine and be with my wife Jane Jones until they attain to the
same age and be assistant to her

I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Jane Jones my best feather bed and furniture to her her heirs
and assigns for ever;

8^{thly}

I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Jane Jones two Negroes viz Tom and Deborah with their future increase
for and during the term of her naturall life and after her decease I give & bequeath the said Negroes Tom
& Deborah with their future increase to be equally divided betwixt my two sons George Jones & Robert Jones her
executors & assigns for ever

9^{thly}

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret Jones our Negroe Gail to her her heirs executors and
assigns for ever

10^{thly}

I give & bequeath unto my Godson William Mayman one young Cowe with her future increase to him his
executors & assigns for ever to be delivered when that my will shall be proved

11^{thly}

I give & bequeath the remainder of my personal estate money plate Jewells Goods Chattells & household stuffe
to be equally divided betwixt my loving wife Jane Jones my two sons George Jones and Robert Jones and my
daughter Elizabeth Jones Provided always this gift to my wife Jane Jones to stand if she doth not meddle or
concerne her selfe with any of my lands more then what before by this my will is ordered & appointed

It is my will and desire that my loving wife Jane Jones be whole executrix of this my last will and testament
and I doe desire my loving Brother George Mitchell and my loving Brother George Betts overseers to be aiding in
the true execution in what is here mentioned in this my last will In witness whereof I have hereunto sett
my hand & seal this sixteenth day of August one thousand six hundred eighty & nine
