The answer to the said Letter is as followeth.

Do not sell thy horse without Order, and if thou wouldst better satisfaction go to S^r Maries Place or take thy Course. — Tho: Jones.

June 14th 1690.

Maryland s. I did Sell Guidge me Francis Gumbly of the County of Somerset Governor my Heirs Executors and dem. to pay or cause to be paid unto Robert Ridgley his Heirs Executors and assigns in the sd County on demand the sum of eight hundred pounds of Tobacco in Cash. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 14th day of March 1696.

Spent the Part of the above Bill was written as followeth. W. Gumbly. Lay the Contents of this Bill to Mr Daniel Carter.

Martha Ridgley

December the 22th 1681. Received then of W. Martha Ridgley One Bill of Francis Gumblyes for eight hundred pounds of Tobacco, which is for the same. I promise to be accountable for to the said Ridgley or else return the same againe untill the 1st of January next as witness my hand 7 day & year a fore —

Witness: Anthony Underwood.

The receipt was Counted: and on the other side was writt

December 5th 1682. Received then of Daniel Carter the sum of Eight hundred pounds of Tobacco by Bill from Francis Gumbly to Mr Robert Ridgley by Order of Thomas Jones and John Hardy — Oblige my self to save harmless the sd Carter for any damage that may happen to him for or by reason of the payment of the same to me as witness my hand the day and year above. Martha Ridgley
