He do hereby grant unto y^e the said Thomas Dixon full power and authority to do in all and singular the goods Chattle & Credits of the said deceased, and to demand collect and levy, all and all manner of debts due and owing to the said deceased and well and faithfully to dispose of the same, and out of the goods Chattle and Credits of the said deceased, wh^{er}ever may or shall come to your hands or possession, well and truly to pay the debts due by the said deceased so far forth as the said will extend and the law will charge y^e according to the true value of the same thereof, y^e having first taken your Oath well and truly to do in the same. And to make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods Chattle and Credits of the said deceased, which have may or shall come to your hands possession or knowledge, appraised in money, and a true and just account off and upon your administration herein, and to exhibit the same into our County Court who wills and prece^d, continuing which Inventory you are presently assigned to perform or at furthest at or before the second Tuesday in June next ensuing, and an account within twelve months from the date of these presents. And lastly we do hereby empower, constitute, ordain and appoint you the said Thomas Dixon to do of all and singular y^e goods Chattle and Credits of the said deceased this eighth day of March in the fourth year of their Majesties Reign, William & Mary by the grace of God of England Scotland France & Ireland King & Queen Defenders of the faith &c. Anno Dom. 1692.

The Condition of this Obligation is such that if the above Comen Thomas Dixon, do well and truly do in upon the Estate of Robert Dubois deceased as well as to pay all and every the debts of the said deceased, upon Pross^r here and obtain from their Majesties Justices in Court. Itt^m to be for at the said Estate will extend to the law require.
