The Court then demanded security of Mr Stephen Luffe for the due performance of his sherrif's place
 Whereupon the sd Luffe came with two sureties viz. Mr Thomas Conob & Cap. John King -
 and the said Luffe did by recognizance acknowledge and confess himself to be justly indebted to their
 Majesties King William & Queen Mary the just sum of two hundred thousand pounds of lawful
 good and merchantable due to be levied on his goods and Chattels lands and tenements for their
 Majesties use & fra. his wife his servants above did acknowledge himself justly indebted in the
 sd sum of two hundred thousand pounds of lawful good & worth - to be levied as above said
 for their Majesties use & fra.

The Condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound Stephen
 Luffe do well and truly perform the place & Office of his sherrif of Somerset County &
 according to his Commission granted. that then this recognizance to be void of none effect otherwise
 to be and remain in full power force and virtue.

Mr James Sangster made Oath to perform to y^e best of his judgment the Office of Attorney for their Majesties
 to his wife to be the Oath of fidelity & allegiance -

Mr. Coler: Doth take Oath of Attorney & Oath of fidelity & allegiance

Mr. Edward Jones took the same Oath of the sd Court. And Mr. John Strawbridge & James

Samuel Worthington. took Oath of fidelity & allegiance & for y^e due performance of his place as subscribers.

Robert Lewis took the same as of Worthington.

Roger Durbin. took Oath of fidelity & allegiance & of a Tryer to the Court.

George Hobbs took Oath of fidelity & allegiance. & Oath of Dep. Clerk to John. Wolfe to be faithful therein

Mr. David Drown produced his Serv. Boy David Morleston to be judged at this Court

against: James. produced his Serv. Boy James Lingoy to be judged

against: Horley produced his Servant Boy James Crawford to be judged

against: David produced his Servant Boy David Erwin to be judged.

None of y^e fore^s servants
 were adjudged.

Commission for adjourning the Probintial Court this day read.

The Court appointed Mr. Roger Woolford. Cap. John King & Mr Stephen Horley to speak to Joseph
 & William Bonables, to do what is necessary to be done towards the repairing or mending the Court
 house: if the sd Bonables refuse the same. then the fore^s Woolford & the rest are by the Court impowred
 to agree with such persons as will undertake the same, whate work is to be expended against the Court
