Wm. Morris was by the sheriff of our County this day brought into Court. In this following mittimus was
 Mary Anne Somerset County
 From the Court. Thomas Howbold and George Wythe. Two of their Majesties Justices of the Peace
 for this County. Do in the presence of the said Justices of the Peace. we being by the said Justices of the Peace of William
 Morris of this aforesaid County Labourer brought before us this day and charged with many notorious and
 Criminal, amongst which is sundry damnable Blasphemies against our blessed Saviour Jesus Christ as any
 man of sound wits could allow probable by many witnesses present. and also for that he is on the behalf of their
 Majesties our Sovereign Lord and Lady King William & Queen Mary hereto Commanded that immediately you
 receive the said William Morris into your Custody and him safely keep in your goal without bail or surety so that
 you have his body before their Majesties Justices of the Peace for this County at the next Court to be holden
 for this County or that he be delivered by the due Order of their Majesties Law. And if you fail you shall as you
 will answer the Contempt at your peril. Given at London the 14: day of April in the 3: year of their
 Majesties Reign by the grace of God over England Scotland France & Ireland Defenders of the Faith &c.
