Know all men by these presents that I Christopher Innes of the County of Somerset Gentles agreed
 to sell unto James & Daniel Smith of the County of Somerset Gentles all the Negroes
 that shall or may appear to be mine, on the South Side of Quantico Creek there being eight barrows and
 Jews at Sampson Wallers Plantation and some at John Marzatts, & John Carvill, all white & do hereby
 bargain & sell and make over unto James & Daniel Smith more or less being for a valuable Consideration in
 hand already & to be by me Christopher Inneswell as witness my hand & seal this first day of September. 1691.

Memorandum this 8th of January 1691. Came the two above mentioned Evidence viz Harnoll and
 Jones, and made Oath upon the holy Evangelists, that the above Bill of Sale was signed, sealed
 owned and delivered in their sight; and of the same made Oath before me David Drown.

Know all men by these presents that I Robert Cathin of Somerset County in the Province of Maryland
 planter do hereby make over unto Gideon Tillman of the same County & Province aforesaid planter, & that
 for the use of Solomon Tillman son to the said Gideon Tillman a proper mark which is currently known
 upon record in the time of Mr George Johnson (viz) the mark is a flower de luce on each side, & a hole in
 the left ear. I the said Robert Cathin do give and give unto the said Gideon Tillman and do make the said mark
 good to the said Tillman his heirs Executors and assigns. As witness my hand this 14th day of June 1692.

 & Lords of the said parts. know ye that we reposing special confidence & trust in y^e Stephen Lupton
 that constituted Ordained & appointed, and do by these presents constitute Ordain & appoint y^e said
 Stephen Lupton to be one of the Sheriffs of our County of Somerset, and to have all such privileges & emoluments
 any other Sheriffs within this our Province have or ever had held or enjoyed, to have & to hold the said
 Office of Sheriffs of our said County for one whole year to be computed from the date hereof, until another Sheriffs
 in your stead shall be by us lawfully by Statute constituted. Provided that y^e said Stephen Lupton do in Open
 Court in the said County, take the usual Oath of Sheriffs, and give good sufficient security for y^e well discharging
 of the said Office according to Law. Witness our hands & wellbeloved. Lionel Copley Esq. Cap. Genl. & Governor
 in Chief in & over our Province of Maryland & the Territories thereto belonging, this eleventh day of
 April in the fourth year of our Queen Anno Domini 1692.
