 Dubliner, do hereby acknowledge that he hath sold unto Randall Lovell of the County of Suffolk
 and Province afore said. of full sum of Two hundred pounds sterling money of England which he promiseth
 to pay to the above said Lovell or to his certain assigns or to his heirs Executors or assigns, for the
 use and behoof of the said Lovell to be well truly paid & paid in many hours, & the said family by these presents
 in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 18th Day of August the said Lovell. one thousand
 six hundred and two

The Condition of the above said obligation is such that if the above said Lovell or his heirs Executors or assigns or
 any of them do well truly perform & finish the building of one Brickhouse already begun upon the said Lovell's
 plantation (viz) so far forth as Bricklayers or Plasterers work doth extend as likewise to give the said Lovell
 Lovell or some of his Brethren in law the full refusal of a tract of land called Williams Purchase bought of the
 said Lovell by the said Daniflor, provided the said Lovell or any of his Brethren in law afore said will give as much for
 the said land as any other person or persons (if to be sold by the said Daniflor) that then this obligation to be void of
 force & otherwise to be & remain in full power force & virtue
