memorandum. the 10th day of June 1691. Letters of the Court was granted by the Court solely to Walter Lane to dem. all and singular the goods &c of Josias Seaward deceased as appears in Lib. M^o. 101. with so word was drawn and directed to m^r George Layfield with Commission to appraise &c also by him upon the 11th of August last past in Walter Lane informed the Court that y^e aforesaid appraisers viz Thomas Newbold and m^r Edmund Howard were both sick and humbly required other appraisers might be appointed being considered that Court ordered that John Emmott and Samuel Child appraise the Estate of Josias Seaward &c and therefore Commission was sent to the said appraisers viz Emmott & Child from y^e Court this day with the Court order.

Know all men by these presents that we Walter Lane Sonat^r & Comm^r of the said County & Province aforesaid, do acknowledge and confess our selves to owe and are indebted unto their Maties Wm & Mary by the grace of God of England &c in the behalf of the Orphans of Josias Seaward late of this County deceased the just sum of four hundred pound Sterling money of England, which we promise to pay to their Maties for the use of the Orphans aforesaid, and for the true performance of the same to be well and truly paid we bind us and each of us, our Heirs, Exors, Adors, to their Maties or to their Justices for the use aforesaid. In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands &c the 30 day of July in y^e 3rd year of their Maties Raign Anno Domini 1691.

Witness of this Obligation is such that if the above Comd Walter Lane, do well and truly observe & satisfy the said Obligation of Josias Seaward deceased bearing date the 27th day of September Anno Domini 1689. as well as all and every the debts upon Order had and obtained from their Maties Justices of Peace in Court sitting upon the said Estate will extend or y^e law requires, and well and truly to observe the several Caus^{es} mentioned herein to you granted the 11th day of July 1691. as also to make no waste sale or destruction off in or upon the lands of Orphans (viz) dwelling house, out house, lands, woods or herds, houses, observing the law entitled for y^e preservation of Orphans real Estate, as also to keep harmless the Justices of Peace of the said County for the same & granting down and all other y^e Officers, that then the Obligation to be void &c of none effect otherwise.
