This indenture made the Twenty third day of April in the second year of the Reigne of our Sovereigne  
Lord and Lady King William and Queen Mary over England &c And in the year of our Lord God one  
Thousand six hundred and Ninety Five Between Thomas Miller of Somerset County in the Province of  
Maryland Merchant Sawyer and Sarah his wife of the one Part And George Layfield of the s<sup>e</sup> County of  
Somerset and Province of Maryland Esq<sup>r</sup> of the other Part Witnesseth That whereas the Lord  
Baltimore by his Deed of grant under the great seal used in the Province of Maryland for granting  
of Land there bearing date at y<sup>e</sup> City of St. Maries in the aforesaid Province of Maryland the one and  
Twenty fifth day of November in the sixth year of his Lordships Dominion over the said Province of  
Maryland anno d<sup>r</sup> m<sup>r</sup> 1680 one thousand six hundred eighty and one did for the consideration therein  
mentioned grant unto John Anderson of the aforesaid County and Province of Maryland all that a  
part of Land called Hogg Quarter Situated Lying & being on the South side of Potowmack river in Som-  
erset County containing Thirteen hundred and fifty acres more or less to have and to hold  
the same to him the said John Anderson his heirs and assigns for ever Under Seals rents Covenants Limitations  
& exceptions as in and by the said Deed of grant (whereof being the record book) more fully and more at large  
it may & doth appear And since vizt on the fifteenth day of December in the seventh year of his said said  
Lordships Dominion one thousand six hundred eighty and one the said John Anderson by his certain Deed  
of Indenture duly executed and enrolled in the said County of Somerset the 14<sup>th</sup> day of Jan: anno d<sup>r</sup> m<sup>r</sup> 1683 a  
of Indenture duly executed and enrolled in the said County of Somerset the 14<sup>th</sup> day of Jan: anno d<sup>r</sup> m<sup>r</sup> 1683  
did make over unto the above named Coll<sup>o</sup> William Stevens the aforesaid Thirteen hundred & fifty acres of Land  
called Hogg quarter to him and to hold the same to him the said William Stevens and to his heirs and assigns  
for ever did him vizt on the seventeenth day of August in the eighth year of the Dominion of the R<sup>t</sup> Hon<sup>ble</sup>  
Charles absolute Lord & Proprietary of the Province of Maryland Lord Baron of Baltimore & in the year  
of our Lord God one thousand six hundred eighty and three the said Coll<sup>o</sup> William Stevens and Elizabeth  
his wife by their certaine Deed of Indenture duly executed & enrolled in the s<sup>e</sup> County of Somerset the 14<sup>th</sup> day  
of October anno d<sup>r</sup> m<sup>r</sup> 1683 for the consideration therein mentioned did grant Bargaine sell & confe  
Confirme unto the above named Thomas Miller and his heirs and assigns for ever a part of the above  
part of Land called Hogg quarter to the quantity of four hundred and fifty acres bounded as followeth  
beginning at a great marked pine standing by a branch backward in the woods near a great swamp and  
running from the said pine South east half a point southerly one hundred & five perches to a live oak standing  
near a white marsh and from the said oak with a line drawing southerwest two hundred and fifty perches to a  
white oak standing in a branch being the head of Hulston Creek divide from the said oak by a line drawn Northwest  
half a point northerly one hundred thirty five perches to a white oak and from the said oak west & by north  
thirty eight perches to a stooping white oak and from y<sup>e</sup> oak northerly half a point northerly with a course  
until it runs to the divisionall line betweene Conyngton and Hogg quarter and from the end of the  
aforesaid line by a right line to the first corner the great line by a branch sides aforesaid containing four hundred  
and fifty acres more or less and is now called Millers lot together with all its rights Privileges & benefits  
thereunto belonging on those conditions as by the said Indenture (whereof being the record book) more fully &  
more at large it may & doth appear Now this Indenture further witnesseth That the above named
