 give graunt bargain sell alienate enfeoffe and confirm unto the above named George Sayfield
 and to his heirs and assigns for ever all that three hundred acres of land being the plantation on which
 the said Thomas Miller now dwelleth and is apart of the above mentioned four hundred & fifty
 of land called Millers Soll Together with all its Rights Benefitts Priviledges and appurtenances to
 belonging or in any wise appertaining (the theife lordes rents alwayes excepted and foreprised)
To have and to hold the aforesaid three hundred acres of land part of Millers Soll and all by
 other the promises hereby meant mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every of them
 there and every of their appurtenances unto him the said George Sayfield and to the heirs and assigns
 the said George Sayfield for ever without any mortgage condition redemption use or limitation to
 alter charge or determine the same And the said Thomas Miller and Sarah his wife the aforesaid three
 hundred acres of land being apart of the land called Millers Soll with the appurtenances before by the
 presents bargained and sold or hereby intended to be bargained & sold unto him the said George Sayfield
 for ever freely acquitt and discharged the same of and from all & all manner of former & other bargain
 graunts sales forfeitures Dowries Joynures surrenders and of and from all other Titles Incumbrances
 Claims and demands whatsoever Claiming by from or under the said Thomas Miller & Sarah
 wife their or either of their heirs executors or assigns or any of them shall & will for ever hereafter
 warrant & defend by these presents In Witnes whereof the said Thomas Miller & Sarah his wife
 their signing their seals and the witnesses subscriptions as Testimonies do manifest the day and
 first above written

MEMORANDUM That this day to witt the Twentieth third day of Aprill in the second year of the
 Reigne of our Sovereigne Lord & Lady King William and Queene Mary over England &c Anno^o
 1690 before us Francis Jentkins and Edmund Howard Two of their Ma^{ties} Justices for some
 County Lane Thomas Miller and Sarah his wife parties to the within Indenture in their proper
 persons and the said Sarah being by the said Justices alone and secretly examined according to
 forme of certaine Act of Assembly in that case made and provided did acknowledge the three
 acres of land part of the four hundred and fifty acres of land called Millers Soll in the within
 written Indenture mentioned to be the right of him the within named George Sayfield as that
 he the said George hath of the gift of them the said Thomas & Sarah his wife and the said Thomas
 & Sarah for them and their heirs and the heirs of the said Sarah hath remitted and made quit
 thereof to the said George & his heirs for ever and further the said Thomas and Sarah hath graunt
 be them and their heirs and all & every the heirs of the said Sarah that the said three hundred
 of land within mentioned unto him the said George Sayfield and his heirs against them the
 Thomas and Sarah & their heirs and all & every the heirs of the said Sarah they will warrant for
 (except as in the within written Indenture excepted) and for this acknowledgement quit Claim &
 the said George Sayfield hath given them the said Thomas Miller and Sarah his wife fiftene Thousand
 pounds of good Merchantable Tobaco
