This Indenture made the second day of August in the second year of y^e reign of our Sovereigne Lord & Lady William & Mary by the grace of god of England Scotland France & Ireland defend^r of the faith or And in the year of our Lord God one thousand six hundred and ninety Betweene Thomas Lyster of Somers^{et} County in the Province of Maryland and Abigail his wife on the one part And Samson Allen of the County & Province aforesaid on the other part Witnesseth That whereas the R^h hon^{ble} Cecilis absolute Lord & Proprietary of the Province of Maryland & Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore or by his Deed of Grant und^r y^e great seals used in the Province of Maryland for granting of Land there bearing date the eight day of February in y^e nine & thirtieth year of the Dominion of the s^d Lord Baltimore over Maryland or Anno^m Do^m 1670 did for the Consideration therein mentioned Grant unto Maurice Lyster of the County & Province aforesaid a tract or parcel of Land called by the name of Morris Hope situate lying & being in Somers^{et} County aforesaid on the Eastern shore upon a bay commonly known by the name of Locomole bay situate in the north side of the said bay bounded as followeth beginning at a marked white oak standing by the side of Locomole bay & running along the said bay side Southward for breadth to a part of land Surveyed for Joseph Luce & from thence running into y^e north west for length by the said Joseph Luce his Land & bounded therewith five hundred & forty four poles to a marked oak & from thence seventy poles north west to a marked oak & from thence with a line drawn south west five hundred thirty four perches to y^e first boundary containing two hundred & fifty acres more or less to have & to hold the said tract or parcel of Land to him the said Maurice Lyster his heires & assignes for ever und^r the same covenant Limitations & exceptions as in & by the said Deed of Grant verously being there unto had more fully & more at large if may & otherwise by wth devise the said Maurice Lyster became possessed of an estate in fee simple in the said Land And since the said grant was on the 12th day of March in y^e second year of the Dominion of the R^h hon^{ble} Charles our Maryland or Anno^m Do^m 1671 the said Maurice Lyster by his certain Deed of Indenture duly executed & enrolled
