

CHIEF DEED IN FINE made the fourtyneth day of Aprill in the third year of the Reign of our  
 Sovereigne Lord James the second by the grace of god King of Englande &c and in the thirteenth year  
 of the Dominion of the R<sup>t</sup> Honourable Charles over Maryland and Avalon Amoung Jo<sup>n</sup> 1608 Betwene  
 Thomas Criford and Susanna his wife of Somersett County & Province of Maryland planteis of the one part and William  
 Hearne of the said County and Province of the other part WITNESSETH that wherab the R<sup>t</sup> Honourable the Lord Pro-  
 prietary by his Deed of grant under the great seal of the Province bearing date at St. Maries the first day  
 of June in the tenth year of our Dominion Amoung Jo<sup>n</sup> 1605 did graunt unto the said Thomas Criford  
 certaintie tract or partell of Land called old Berry situate Lying & being on the east side of the pialk bay in  
 river called Potomack on the south east side of the said river about four miles back in the woods bounded ab-  
 followeth beginning at a marked white oak standing near Mattapeny Carr Road to Potomack river on the  
 Southward side of a partell of Land surveyed for Richard Peper Jun<sup>r</sup> thence with a line drawne south south  
 west one hundred and six perches to a marked white oak standing by a branch thence containing same course  
 into the branch thence perches thence with a line drawne south east by south one hundred forty perches  
 to a partell of Land surveyed for Tobias Peper to a marked white oak being a corner tree of the said Peper  
 thence with a line drawne east by south two hundred and twenty perches thence with a right line  
 drawne to the first bounde containing & now laid out for two hundred acres more or lesse according to  
 certificate Survey therof taken & returned into the Land office at the City of St. Maries bearing date yevn<sup>r</sup>  
 second of December one thousand six hundred eightys three and there remaining upon record together  
 with all rights Profitts Benefits and Priviledges therunto belonging royall mines excepted  
 to have & to hold the same to him the said Thomas Criford his heires & assignes for ever vid.  
 further covenants servites and Provisors as in the said grant is mentioned & expressed  
 recourse being thereto had if dotti more fully and more at large appear now before the knowyng  
 that of the said Thomas Criford & Susanna his wife for divers good payntes & valuable Consideracions  
 whereunto moving but more especially & perlitularly for and in consideration of thre  
 thousand pounds of Rialto to be in hand paid by William Hearne aforesaid the receipt  
 whereof we do by these presents acknowledge and that hereby we are fully satisfied contented  
 and paid by and thereof of every part & partell thereof we the said Thomas Criford & Susanna doe  
 hereby acquitt exonerate & discharge the said William Hearne his heires & assignes for ever how  
 given graunted bargained sold feoffed and confirmed And as by these presents doe graunt grant  
 bargaine allene sell enforfe confirme unto him the said William Hearne the said tract of land called  
 old Berry land out bristed & bounded as aforesaid containing by measure Two hundred acres more  
 or lesse TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE said tract of land together with all the Profitts benefits  
 and appurtenances therunto belonging Royall mines excepted unto him the said William  
 Hearne his heires and assignes for ever the said Thomas Criford Thomas Criford for  
 himself his heires & executors adm<sup>r</sup> & assignes dotti further covenant y the said William Hearne  
 now is and standeth by force & virtue of these presents lawfully & absolutely seized of the said Land  
 called old Berry & every y<sup>r</sup> m<sup>r</sup> without any condition or limitation of all or any y<sup>r</sup> or m<sup>r</sup> to  
 alter charge or determine or make vid<sup>e</sup> y<sup>r</sup> same & that the said Land called old Berry with the and  
 every of the appurtenances noware & shall bee for ever hereafter remaine continue and be unto  
 the said William Hearne his heires and assignes free & freely Cleare & Clearly acquitt exonerated  
 and discharged of and from all & all manner of former & other quicke grants leases foynes and  
 wills annuities intailles statutes recognizances bonds & writings except leizures condemnacions  
 rents arrearages of rents intusions forfeitures mortgages fines debts of Record by the said  
 charged by ministrancies whatsoeuer had made committed done or suffered by me the said Thomas  
 Criford & Susanna his wife for the same to be by my consent assent and meanbor pertement and  
 further the said Thomas Criford & Susanna his wife for them selfe their heires & executors and  
 assignes
