unto me, for the mere better Ordering of his earthly benefits he had been pleased to endow me withall in
Case he should be pleased to call me now out of this transitory life. I do in this first place humbly resign my soul
to god who gabs it trusung and solivous absolutely in the precious blood of my dear Saviour Jesus Christ for my
redemption, and my body to be buried decently and Christian like buried, and for his temporall settings wher
he has in his morty bestowed upon me. I have in manner and form followinge hereby rebaung of clyamency and
Confirmyng ratifying and establishing that as my absolute last will & last will and testament. — Imprimis I
desire that if my living wife shall thinke fit & convenient to sell and dispose of my working tools, to pay salfe
and clear my debts, and for the land that I bought, to lett it fall and to reserve the money left against what I paid
for it being two thousand pounds of tobacco. And for my Cows and Calves that are now livinge as I suppose to remain
in and under my wifes husion, for the propper, benefit and good of her and my two sons. Not in any wise to bargean
to bargean, sell or dispose of any the said stots or horses interwaft till the childen arive to the age of thirteene
yeare, and then to be equally divided, my wife to habe until then the male interwaft, but after to run wholly
to and for the childens propper and entie benefit as well male as female, also eight ewes & lambes &
babes in ones and the self same nature & spacio, for the same time and next to be divided before, And for
all my household goods in general, I bequate and bate absolutely unto the propper use and behoef of my
dear wife (my two gins excepted) wher I have unto my two sons, And for what debts are due unto me
I wholly bate and bequate unto the propper use and behoef of my dear wife and childen. And in
Case my wife should marrie after my decease I desire my two sons may free for themselves at the
age of twenty yeare, and for what hefft I have I bate wholly for the good of my wife and childen
and further I constitue Ordaine and appoint my dear wife as my absolute and sole Executrix of this my
last will and testament, And for testess for to prove the due performance of the same, I nominate
and choise my very good friends John Emmett and Samyson Allen. In witness whereof I have here
unto set my hand and affixed my seal. This 4th day of March A.D. Dom. 1691.
