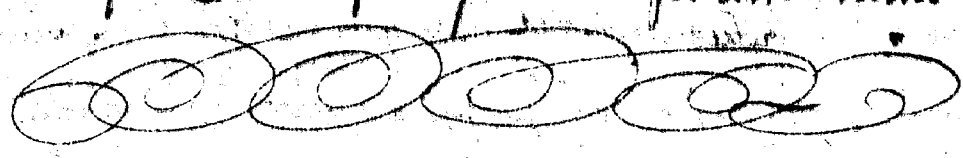

pounds Sterling money of England, & the said Jones & Down in the sum of two
pounds Sterling money and, and to be paid on their goods & Chattels lands & Tenements
for their Maties use & fra. — The condition of this recognizance is
if the above named Ellis Cleman his wife & domestic do make their personal appearance at
our next County Court to be held on the second Tuesday in June then & there to answer to
as shall be objected against them on behalf of their Maties then the sum of four pounds
of new gold, otherwise to be & remain in full power for & to be paid
