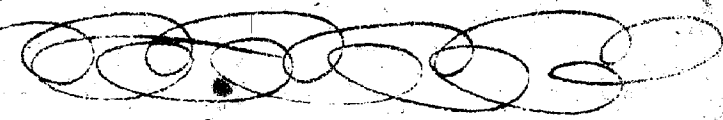


which sheweth as he giveth security to keep the County undisturbed from all charges or

 of recognizance or knowlege & confess himself to owe & be indebted to their Majesties King
 in Queen Mary the sum of thirty pounds sterling money of England, & the said Henry
 Hall the sum of fifteen pounds sterling money, due to be paid on their goods & chattels
 and other commodities for their Majesties use & service.

The condition of which recognizance is such that if the above named John. & Henry Hall do maintain
 and keep a sufficient child lately begotten of the body of a former John. Widdham, so that
 this County of Somerset be never so undisturbed thereby, as also be of his good behaviour &
 abstinence to all their Majesties Liege people of that shire, during this their Majesties pleasure
 and also pay off of debt, that then this recognizance be void & of none effect & so
 to remain in full power force & virtue.
