The Grand Jury for the County of this County on the 14th of June in the year of our Lord 1693. at Monmouth within the Jurisdiction of this upon their Oath, do present John Bishopp of this County Labourer, for that the said John. on the 17th day of December last at New Hill Town in this County aforesaid has and there most wickedly prephantly & presumptuously did utter a word to the Honour of our Lord the King's Oath & many Laths and to the dishonour of God the evil Example of others and against the Peace and against the Laws of this Great Britain. Done at the Court of Sessions

Sworn in Court against Bishopp & sent up to the Grand Jury.

Bill found Dilla bira: Ju: Bums & found.
After the Indictment was read the said Bishopp desired the favour of the Court promising amendment of life. But was by the Court found according to Law & committed to the first Prison. Order the said Bishopp give security for his good behaviour first of all whereupon came the said Bishopp with his security Robert. Lewis. and the said Bishopp did by way of Recognizance acknowledge himself to be indebted to their Majesties King William & Queen Mary the sum of ten pounds Sterling money of England & the said Rob. Lewis the sum of five pounds like money and both due to be levied on their goods & Chattels Land & Tenements for their Majesties use &c.

Condition of which Recognizance is such that if the above bound John Bishopp be of the good behaviour & abstinence to all their Majesties Liege people of this Great Britain during this Court's pleasure as also pay his fine & feed then the Recognizance to be void & of none effect otherwise to be & remain in full power force & virtue.
