To above half my Gun stolen out of my Loft, but how much I cannot tell but that so it thinks they need 15. Dollars, & my house broken up.

And this day (viz) the day after the Jurors of the foresaid Jury & their Matrs and I so James Gray & Maryarath his W^f made their return to the Court in Court, each man being particularly called, being unanimously agreed of their verdict their Matrs & the defendants his wife being called. The verdict is in these express words (viz) we of the Jury find them not guilty of this Indictment.

Where verdict aforesaid being read, the Court ordered the same to be entered. and further ordered the said James Gray to find security for him self & W^fs good behavior during pleasure & for Officers fees. Whereupon came the said James Gray with his security Cap^t Wm. Culbourn. And the said Gray did acknowledge him self to be indebted to their Matrs James Wm & Quon Mary the sum of twenty pounds Sterling money of England and the said Cap^t Wm. Culbourn in the sum of ten pounds like money due to be paid on their goods & Chattels Lands & Commodities for their Matrs use & tra.

The Jurors of which Recognizance is due that if the above bound James Gray and Maryarath his W^f be of their good behavior & abearance to all their Matrs Liors & people of this Province during the Courts pleasure, ad also pay Officers fees, then this Recognizance to be void & of none effect otherwise to be & remain in full power force & virtue.
