

Whereupon came the said John Whaples wife his other sonnes wife by Capt. Willm. Gage
 & Rought. Barber. And the said Sover. did by recognizance in Open Court before him at the
 most h. & our sovereign Lord & Lady Lucy William & Queen Mary their Lords & Sisters
 the sum of twenty pounds sterl. money of England to the said Capt. Culbourn & Rought
 in the sum of ten pounds apiece his money due to be paid on their goods & Chattels lands &
 tenements for their Malice up to her.

The Execution of this Recognizance is this that if the above named John Whaples & his
 good behaviour & abearance to all their Malice & goods & chattels & lands
 then the Recognizance to be bold & of good foyt, Norway to be remain in full power
 for to & before.

Also wife came the said John Whaples with his other sonnes wife by Capt. Willm. Gage
 & Rought. and the said Sover. did at knowledg him selfe to be indebted to the said Justices of
 Somerset County Court the sum of five thousand pounds of tobacco, & the said Willm. Gage & Rought did
 acknowledge themselves to be indebted to the said Court the sum of five & twenty hundred pounds of tobacco
 which due to be paid on their goods & Chattels lands & houses for their Malice up to her.

The Execution of this Recognizance is this that if the above named John Whaples do well
 & truly performe to pay fifty dayes work with diet & tools, whiche by the Justices of Somerset
 County Court shall demand as also all Court charges, whiche charges the said Gage & Rought assumed in Court
 to pay. Then the Recognizance to be bold, Norway to be remain in full power for to & before.

Heir of Paties I somerset for the service for their Malice Comyn sworn upon the
 body coming first at a grand Jury held for the body of this County
 do present & find that Thomas. Carter of Winscombe in
 witness the jurisdiction of this Court not having the fear of God before
 his eyes but frustrated by the devil, upon the Sabbath or Lord's Day before
 Augst. Court 1692 did most wilfully & grossly abuse the said Sabbath & go into the Maner
 upon the said Winscombe to Riber & Abrey L. the Landing place of Wm. Elgate, did there & he
 did followingly kill two Barrows & one sow belonging to Mr. Francis Jenkins of this County
 & the value of eight hundred pounds of tobacco, and when the others of the said in the
 jointing his hoggs did right wounding them, that severall of the hoggs were taken downe & the
 great hurt & damage of the said Mr. Francis Jenkins, the hurt of the good people of this County
 & dishonour of almighty God, because of the laws broken & done and against their Malice.
