The Condition of the Roguizans is such that if the above Comd Edward Day, or will & truly satisfy Content & pay unto the aforesd Thomas Walker Son to the full Cap. Thomas Walker, the sum & sum of money that shall become due to the said Thomas Son of the said Thomas aforesd when at age of One & twenty years from the Roguizans to be paid & of none sort, otherwise to be & remaine in full power for & value. — — — — —
