


Walter Lande Esq. v. Josias Seaward Esq. in the County of Middlesex. Master of the Court of all Pleas in the County of Middlesex. Goods Chattels & Debts of Josias Seaward vs. Walter Lande Esq. To answer into the Court of a plea of trespass & assault.

And whereupon the said John by Peter Seaward Esq. Advocate for the said Josias in his life time, to wit the 23. day of August in the year of our Lord 1689 at London in the Jurisdiction of this Court was indebted to the said John in the sum of four hundred thirty pounds of lawfull money, being as well for sundry Physicall means Expended as also for his labour pains & attendants on the said Josias in his life time, & the said Josias in his life time, to the said John in manner aforesaid being indebted, did assume & faithfully promise, that he the said Josias the said sum to the said John would well & truly Content & pay. Whereby the said Josias in his life time, nor the said Walter Lande to whom the sum of all & singular the goods Chattels & Debts of the said Josias, since the date of the said Josias in his life time, and the said Walter since the date hath been due, but hath utterly refused, & doth still refuse to the damage of the said John of 1000. Pounds of lawfull money, & thereupon he bringeth his suit here.

Done in the Court of the King's Bench the 23. day of August 1689. John de Ring Esq.
