 humbly sheweth.

That your most humble petitioner resideth in the County of Somerset since the last taking of J^o.
 was by W^o. Francis: your petitioner was arrested for some words, as he alleged, your most humble petitioner
 should say, and my to Blasphemy, and was so bound upon your petitioner that he was to leave his
 house his habitation, slaves, stock and all other things fitting & necessary for your petitioner & his
 wife & Children's subsistence, and since his absence, his Negro slaves his stock and goods are taken
 the means of the aforementioned Francis's goods taken away, & being at great distance down in
 the Colony of Virginia from his habitation, & hearing of your most Excellent's fair will
 in this province, and well knowing that he the said Morris himself was wholly innocent of what
 is alleged against him; not doubting but that your Excellency of your just goodness will be pleased
 to grant your humble petitioner that favour that he may return to the said County to look after
 his wife and Children and what belongs to your humble petitioner in Somerset County, he giving
 good security to the Court or your Honour's persons in what County the said County that your
 Excellency shall think fit, to appear before the Court of the said County, or to fore
