The deposition of Bryan Comerway aged about twenty eight years, he Combs says that he came to James Barry's house, & he was putting up of a door as he said & he bid his wife go & get some nails for to nail up that board eare. H. Edm. Blafield took them down & he said that he bought the mark of Robert Catlin & he named his hogg's mark, but he forgot it. Only he said there was a hole in right ear, & few scrobbles & ground soe near, Only a cropp & a slit

Wherefore said Jury as in fo: 56 returns in Court, and Comerway & others say man particularly by his name, being all unanimously agreed of the verdict the pte - Dr. found. Comerway his wife called. The verdict is read as follows (i.e. 1692)

We of the Jury upon a broad inspection having noted a greater light do find James Barry not guilty of this wite in Judgement given in the cause of Samuel Handy

Wherefore the said verdict was p Court Ordered to be Entered.
