The Condition of this Obligation is such that if the above bounden Walter Owen shall personally be & appear before Justice of the Peace County Court to be holden the second Tuesday in August then & there to answer the said Walter, what shall be offered against him, as also to submit & abide judgement thereon this Obligation to be void & of none effect or otherwise to remaine, in full force strength effect & virtue.
