Gentlemen
Their Majesties having been ^{graciously} pleased by their letters Brought Date September 25th 1692
to grant unto us your office & Employment of their Secretary of Maryland with power to nominate
& appoint Clerks respectively to your severall Counties of this Province, and forasmuch
as I am yet a stranger to the Qualifications of such as are fittest to serve
in that Capacity, but most desirous if your office may be executed in such manner
as may be most for their Majesties and consequently for your Countys service I do therefore
for this first time without prejudice to my Right, request of you your Honour to Certify
to me by your first opportunity whom you shall judge your most honest and able Clerk for
that Employment to be executed by himselfe or not by a Deputy, and if you bring my said
your Certificate shall be sufficiently empowered by us to perform our duty to your
Countys Satisfaction, this is at present what I have to impart to you from your
our Margent of your Letter
Your humble Servant Thomas Larrenid

It must bring your name of two persons who will be security with him to the certify me for any mispractices
he shall commit in your Execution of this office.
