Indenture being made to witness that the said Elizabeth in Open Court confessed fully and said that Robert M. do well
was the father of her then said Child. Whereupon it was ordered that records should be made of the said Elizabeth's
affidavit at our next County Court to be held at Menequin 2^d Tuesday in October to answer to matters here. Ordered
that the wife the said Mary pay at a fine 25 day's work diet & tools, & to give security for her good behavior
till the 1st of Feb.

Whereupon came the said Elizabeth with her two servants Wm. Brittingham & Thomas Wilson the said Elizabeth did confess
her self to owe and be indebted unto their Majesties King Wm. & Queen Mary the sum of 10. Sterling & her servants in the
sum of five pounds & the money all due to be levied on their goods & Chattels Lands & Tenements for their Majesties use
the said Elizabeth did acknowledge that if the above said Elizabeth had been of
the good behavior & abstinence to all their Majesties Judges & Courts of this Province during this Court's pleasure, as also pay
her fine & fees. Then the above said Elizabeth to be bound to remain in full force & virtue.

In this Court the humble Petition of Thomas Roberts sheweth that by his Honor by his appointment of in James
Roberts did carry sundry writs upon the Country's service to John Darby at Followers in New Castle County
in the Counties of Comberland about wine into all methods of violence. This was done for my self & wife
coming in my out journey & returning twelve days for wine with my unaccountable expense. Humbly pray this
Court's favourable allowance, & if possible shall ever pray for.

Given under the hand of the said Court the 10th of June 1693 that the said Roberts pay the said Roberts 440. of law.

In this matter the Justice of the Peace for the County of Somerset in Court now sitting. The humble Petition of Mary
Griffiths Widow & Relict of James Griffiths humbly sheweth that by his Honor by his last will & testament
of her said husband was left in her by part of his whole Estate as well real as personal during her Widowhood
but so it is may it please your Honor that my two sons in Law, with out regard to the said will, or the said Relict's
right attempt to build themselves upon the said Relict's Land without her leave or consent, to the great grief and
prejudice of the said poor Relict who is daily molested & most highly abused & threatened to be turned out of my own
house & wholly hood. I have news to accuse my self too, nor any of my children only if I were, which I have had little
been shown in preferring the Peace & Rights of the Widow & being as are oppressed. Therefore most heartily beg
the Honors may be considered, that if your Honor will Order that the said sons in Law, may appear before you, and give
reasons for their so unjust molestation, so as the said Relict may enjoy her own in quiet, and if the said Relict shall stand
in duty bound pray for.

Upon which the Honors my said. it was by the Justice Ordered that Cornelius Ward & Thomas Ward do
make their personal appearance at our next County Court to be held 2^d Tuesday in November
next to answer the Complaint of Mary Griffiths.
