 here into Court the date whereof is the day & year aforesaid and acknowledged himself to be bound to the said sum of

 & norps are holden & firmly bound unto Henry Smith of the same County, More. in the full & just sum of three thousand  
 four hundred fifty six pounds of good sound merchantable leaf tobacco & take to be paid to the said Henry Smith  
 his certain Attorney, Executors or Assigns, to whose payment well & truly to be made & done, we bind our selves our  
 heirs of our heirs. Extent & down faithfully & literally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals & dated this 14<sup>th</sup>  
 day of August 1690.

The Conditions of the above Obligation is such that if the above bound Thomas Davis his heirs or Assigns  
 shall well & truly pay or cause to be paid unto the aforesaid Henry Smith his heirs, Executors or Assigns the full & just  
 two thousand one hundred & sixty foot of good sound Justice of the Peace Blanks. That is to say one thousand & sixty  
 foot of said Blanks to be paid at or before the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January ensuing one thousand & eighty five of the  
 5<sup>th</sup> or before the 10<sup>th</sup> day of March ensuing the date of these presents, then the Obligation to be void & of none
