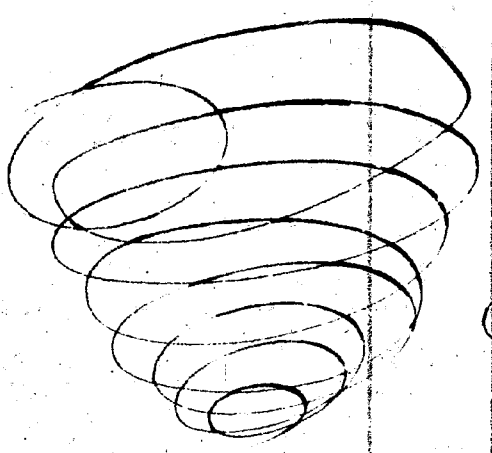

Errors Excepted & no John: King.

The aforesaid acc^t. being read in Open Court, in y^e audience of the said Court, where then Confess to the said
 acc^t. and therefore Order was by Court granted against the said John: King for so running him according to the
 of Assembly and for y^e tobacco with the said Court.

Upon y^e Motion against James Barlowe of. John: M^r Smith etc. appeared in the fo: 46: Bate parlied this day app^r
 the sd M^r Smith in Open Court made Oath that he stood in fear that the sd James would do him harm in either
 in his Body or Estate // and thus the Court ordered that the sd James should give good Security
 for his good Behaviour etc. // Whereupon James the said James & the two Servants Thomas Beauchamp
 and Wm. Warwick. And the said James did acknowledge and Confess: that he had taken the said M^r Smith
 in the sum of ten pounds Sterling money & the said James offered in the sum of five pounds a piece like money
 all due to be levied on their goods & Chattels Lands & Tenements for their Master's use etc.

The Condition of this Recognizance is such that if the above named James be of the good Behaviour aforesaid
 to all their Master's Negro Servants of this Province, & more especially to John: M^r Smith during this Court
 pleasure do also pay the said fee. that then the above Recognizance to be void & of none effect. Otherwise
 to remain in full power force & virtue.

Ordered like unto said James Barlowe upon y^e Oath & Summons upon Contempt of sd matter
 (viz) in refusing to obey the Sentence etc.
