House bill, File No. 558, entitled "An Act to add an additional section to Article 22 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'Washington County,' sub-title 'Hancock,' to follow section 241, and to be designated as 'Section 241 A.' giving power to the Burgess and Commissioners of Hancock to regulate, license and tax restaurants, breweries and all saloons and other places where malt, spirituous, vinous and fermented liquors are sold."
