House bill, File No. 40, entitled "An Act to appropriate a sum of money for the maintenance of the Fifth Regiment Armory."

Which was read the second time.

Also favorably,

House bill, File No. 183, entitled "An Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay the claim of Charles J. Byrne for balance of salary due him as receiving clerk in State Tobacco Warehouse number one during the year 1902."

Which was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Also favorably,

House bill, File No. 482, entitled "An Act to make an appropriation for the Maryland Board of Pharmacy."

Which was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Also favorably,

Senate bill, File No. 204, entitled "An Act to add an additional section to Article 26 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title 'Courts,' to be known as 'Section 44,' relating to the payment of salaries to certain classes of judges after their retirement from office."

Which was read the second time.

Also unfavorably,

House bill, File No. 430, entitled "An Act to appropriate the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000,) to the County Commissioners of Allegany county, in order to reimburse them for an advancement of said sum in order to complete and finish the State Normal School Building at Frostburg, in the year 1901."

Which unfavorable report was adopted.
