by ballot whether spirituous or fermented liquors or alcoholic bitters shall be sold in said county, and to regulate the terms and conditions on which the sale thereof may be made in case the majority of the voters of said county shall determine said question in the affirmative,' and to regulate the sale thereof by druggists and pharmacists."
