

Also favorably.

House bill, File No. 663, entitled "An Act to prohibit the delivery, the bringing for the purpose of delivery, and the having in possession for said purpose of delivery of spirituous, vinous, malt or brewed liquors within any city, town or township, borough, place governed by borough commission, village, seaside resort or other municipality in this State in which there is no existing license for the sale of said liquors or any of them."

On motion of Mr. Godwin,

It was moved, to refer the bill to the Judiciary Committee.

On motion of Mr. Collins,

It was moved to postpone indefinitely the motion to refer the bill to the Judiciary Committee.

Which was carried.

The Chair ruled that the motion carried the bill with it.

Mr. Atkinson moved to reconsider the vote by which the bill was indefinitely postponed.

Which was carried.

The bill was then referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Also favorably,

House bill, File No. 653, entitled "An Act to prohibit the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer at any place in Garrett county within three miles of Lower Savage school house in the village of Bond, Garrett county, Maryland."

Which was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Johnston, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably,

Senate bill, File No. 37, entitled "An Act to add an additional section to Article 81 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title 'Revenue and Taxes,' sub-title 'Payment of Taxes by Corporations,' to follow section 81 A, and to be designated as 'Section 81 B.'"
