AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

Section 59. (29). To regulate the use of the streets, lanes and alleys of Cambridge by telephone, telegraph, electric light and other wires and poles, in over and upon the same, providing that nothing in this section shall be construed as to give the Commissioners of Cambridge the power and authority to impose any license fees upon such wires and poles or the use of said streets and alleys."

Strike out section 50 and insert the above.

Section 69, line 3, strike out "fifty" and insert "forty-five."
