Ordered, That the Speaker be authorized to appoint such additional members of the Engrossing Committee as he may deem necessary (together with the Chairman and Clerk of Claims Committee) in order that the bills may be properly enrolled for the Governor's signature after the close of the session, April 4th, 1904. The Chairman of Claims Committee to issue certificates for such additional help.
