Whereas, The Election Committee of the House of Delegates having determined that James de B. Walbach, being duly returned elected is found eligible and Hungerford Smoot while returned elected is found ineligible.

Resolved, therefore, That James de B. Walbach be and he is hereby determined to be a member of this body and entitled to his seat in this body, and Hungerford Smoot is hereby determined not to be a member hereof.
